TEACHING PORTFOLIO, professor Pieter Vanhuyse

1. Pedagogical idea/Basic view

I strongly believe in the value and societal importance of university teaching. This is an integral and intrinsically enormously valuable and important task of university professors at all levels. Intrinsic is key here on both sides: one teaches and learns best when one does it for its own sake rather than because of external rewards or pressures -- i.e. out of a genuine sense of mission, resp. interest. Interactive and discussion-based teaching is key here. Second, I strongly believe in the value of a sustained and wide rather than narrow reading and education across various fields and subfields for students. This, in order to give students a solid basis in understanding multiple approaches to any given major social science topic or problem, and the multiple social, cultural, economic, and political-institutional causal forces and social mechanisms at work behind almost any social-scientifically important event. Some of my views on this educational philosophy have been published in *Education Review* (Vanhuyse 2006).

This means at least two things. First, students at all levels should ideally be thoroughly familiarized not just with groundbreaking contemporary work but also with classic contributions to the field of study in question. Crucially, students should also be deeply familiar with the best writing on various logics of social explanation. Political science and social science more generally advance fastest by developing and then falsifying (or contingently corroborating) new theories aiming to explain interesting social phenomena or puzzles. This implies that students ought to be deeply immersed in the most insightful general books on the logics of social explanation. Second, to stimulate original research contributions, graduate-level students ought also to be given a strong familiarity with selected seminal contributions beyond their field from related and partly overlapping fields. For political science students this would include for instance public policy, political economy, sociology, and behavioral economics. The aim is to provide the basis for cross-fertilizing insights from various disciplines and angles, and thus at least the potential for genuinely original new insights and theories subsequently. In this respect, to use Isaiah Berlin's famous metaphor, my sympathies as a teacher (and researcher) are more with foxes than with hedgehogs (Vanhuyse 2006).

2. Teaching Experience

I have supervised numerous undergraduate and graduate essays and theses as well as project collaborations such as informal reading groups. I have a genuine love of, and long experience in, teaching, fine-tuned over more than 30 university courses taught at the BA, MA and PhD levels at academic institutes in Denmark, the Czech Republic, England, Hungary, Israel, Italy, Lithuania, Spain and Poland. At SDU, in addition to extensive teaching at the political science department, I have co-founded 'Radical Rethink,' our first-ever five-faculty interdisciplinary talent course, in which I taught as the SAMF Faculty representative.

I have also been on the teaching staff of a large Faculty of Education for seven years (University of Haifa), where the main target audience was current and future teachers and where all lecturers were given frequent informal coaching on pedagogical skills, best-practice advice and new developments.

For tests and exams, I have used various formats including multiple-choice exams, oral exams, take-home exams, and weekly participations in and presentations to class. I have wide experience in teaching methods, including teaching and co-teaching ex cathedra, by means of seminars and workshops, and one-to-one tutoring. As a believer in interdisciplinarity and innovation, and Senior Fellow at the interdisciplinary Danish Institute for Advanced Study (DIAS), I have also been a co-founding teacher (and the SAMF Faculty representative) of SDU's first ever 5-faculty course 'Radical Rethink! The Future of Aging Societies - SDU INTER Talent program' (Studyboard of Market and Management Anthropology, Economics, Mathematics-Economics, and Environment, Odense, summer 2019-spring 2020).
