

Master Class on Interpretive Description by Professor Sally Thorne on April 3rd from 10 am 4 pm

Dear all

Thank you for your registration to present your projects in relation to the Interpretive Description Master Class held by professor Sally Thorne. We are already around 50 registered participants and registration is still open for participants who attend (without presentation).

I will be facilitating the day where Professor Sally Thorne will give an approximately two-hour lecture on the nerdier approach to Interpretive Description. In this class, we hope to unpack the implications of the epistemological underpinnings of interpretive description, considering how an epistemological lens can shape study design, the advantages and disadvantages of borrowed theoretical frameworks, and the challenge of creating analytic processes that stay true to the nature of the knowledge claims we seek to generate. In that the approach is seeking to integrate an ethos of knowledge translation throughout all aspects of study design and application, we will critically reflect on what it means to engage in research for the purpose of developing knowledge informed by a disciplinary lens in an applied practice field. We hope to unravel questions like: What makes it an ID study? What are the epistemological underpinnings in ID? How does an ID study differ from other methodologies? How far can you take your interpretations in an ID study? How to combine ID with a theoretical framework (or not)? If an ID study aim stems from practice how far should you take the study to ensure the recirculation to practice (and on what levels political, management, clinical practice)? etc.

There will be approximately 25 minutes in all for each presentation: 10 minutes to present the project and pose two or three questions to Dr Sally Thorne, and 10 - 15 minutes to go into dialogue with Dr Sally Thorne and the audience. We encourage you to keep the time to leave room for discussion.
