## Teaching Practice

I have taught at UCLA, University of Copenhagen, University of Edinburgh and University of Southern Denmark and I enjoy teaching at every level from BA to PhD. Most of my teaching is within my own discipline (philosophy) where I most frequently teach in my specialties – epistemology, philosophy of science, philosophy of mind.
