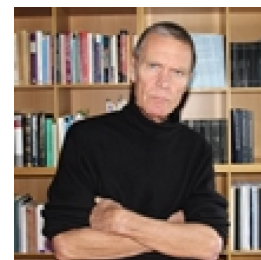

University Courses

The innumerable lectures in-service training courses, seminars etc. that Tim Jensen, also in his capacity as director of the private consultancy Dacorec, has offered to a very wide variety of higher education institutions, to public and private institutions and businesses (e.g. open university, the police school, hospitals and schools for nurses, prison authorities, education of social workers, to judges, to journalists, to the Danish secret service, for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, public elementary schools and upper-secondary schools, etc.) are not listed. A. University of Southern Denmark 2007-2014

This period selected because the Blackboard system has been in function since 2007 and kept track of courses offered. There is no written records of the university courses offered from 1995 to 2007 Each semester has 13 weeks, and each week two lectures. Normal work load is 3 courses per semester. Due to Tim Jensen's many tasks, 'paid' by way of a reduction in teaching load, as respectively Head of Institute and Head of Department, Tim Jensen has lectured somewhat less than normally for some years.
